RICHARD: You don't have to say anything.

JIM: Then what am I doing here?

RICHARD: I don't know, what ARE you doing here?

JIM sighs.

JIM: I'm not sure. Maybe I just want to believe someone is

listening to listen to me.

RICHARD nods.

We find ourselves in the same office.

RICHARD sits in the chair with a notepad, and SARAH lies on the couch, heads towards RICHARD.

SARAH sighs.

SARAH: I'm not sure. Maybe I just need to talk it out with

ACT I SCENE 11

ROBIN: I'm not sure. But I'm afraid to not be here right now.

LISA: I'm not sure. There just doesn't seem to be a point

MARY: I want to not hate him every time I look at him.

PHIL: I want to understand what they DID to me.

KAREN: (overlapping) I have to stop feeling this way.

KURT: (overlapping) I can't stop crying.

AARON: (overlapping) I just want to not be scared anymore.

PETE: (overlapping) I need to figure out how to believe in

myself.

HARRIET: (overlapping) I can't believe that anyone truly loves

me.

SILENCE. Spotlight on RICHARD.

RICHARD: Then what am I doing here?

RICHARD: (to himself) What ARE you doing here?

RICHARD: Trying to help.

BLACKOUT.
